LESSON 9

Anti-Alcohol Ad



OBJECTIVE: Students understand how alcohol can harm their brain development.

GRADE LEVEL: 6-12

TOPIC: The Brain

TIME: 50-60 minutes

VOCABULARY: SADD, Alcohol

MATERIALS NEEDED: Construction paper, colored pencils, and anything

else students use as props.

STARTER:

- Review that SADD is an acronym for Students Against Destructive Decisions.
- Ask the students if they remember how old you are when your brain is fully developed. Answer: <u>25</u>
- Remind the students that this does not mean they are done learning by 25. It just means their brain is done developing and growing.
- Today, we are going to make an Ad.

ACTIVITY:

- The students should work in groups for this activity.
- Help the groups make Anti-Alcohol Ads. These can be very creative but appropriate.
- These can be as long or short as you feel best for your students.
- The students can make props in their groups as well.
- Allow each group to present their Anti-Ad to the class.

WRAP UP:

- Remind the students that alcohol is extremely dangerous to their developing brains.
- Remember, alcohol is a chemical substance that can alter the way your mind and body function.
- You need to be able to make smart and safe decisions. We can do this by not drinking alcohol or using other drugs.
